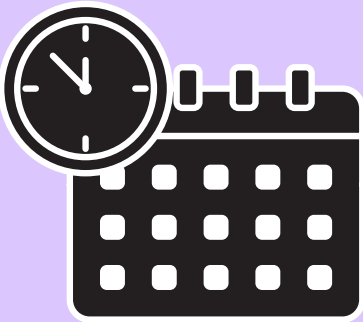
The exhibition is Pay What You Can, you are welcome to book a ticket, or just arrive on the day you wish to attend, subject to availability.

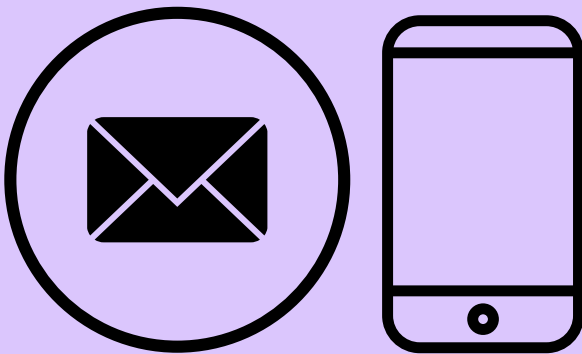

Somerset House has several entrances, for this exhibition we advise you arrive via the Strand Entrance (pictured here). Walk through the left hand side arch

Once you walk through the Strand Entrance you will see a large courtyard (pictured below).

There is a build site for a Skate rink.

Walk down the left hand side of the railings and along the left hand side of the courtyard.





Continue along the left hand side of the Courtyard



You will then see the two entrances for the South Wing.

There is a ramp accessible route



Right of this, there is a direct entry up some steps.

You will now be in Seamen's Hall (pictured below).

This is the main area for the event and will feature a DJ.



Here you will also find the entrance to the exhibition on the right hand side (pictured below)



If you need any further assistance or have any questions please ask a member of staff.

Toilets are available down the corridor and disabled accessible toilets are down the opposite corridor.

There will be a decompression room available - this will be sign posted and attended by a member of staff.



Access packs will be available from the exhibition entrance.

These contain noise cancelling headphones, magnifying glass sheet for reading any printed text, a large print guide and a stress ball.
