The London College of Fashion alumna has been working in the fashion industry for 10 years for companies such as Selfridges, Louis Vuitton and Ganni. In 2019 she started THE FASHION BLUEPRINT, an award-winning community hub supporting independent, black-owned, sustainable fashion brands.

Ibz (Lord Tusk) is a London-based multidisciplinary artist and cultural producer. With a strong background in music production and performance, Ibz has collaborated with established artists, toured globally, and contributed to numerous films, documentaries, fashion shows and ads. Currently, their focus is on filmmaking, where they address and reshape perceptions of racism, black masculinities, class, and injustice. Ibz has participated in debates and panels at prestigious venues such as Tate Modern, Serpentine Gallery and Brooklyn Museum.

Aoibheann is a multidisciplinary artist based at Somerset House and the founder of Rodeo Oracle, a coaching and mentoring platform for visual artists and creatives. Through personalized sessions, she blends transformative coaching with industry-focused mentorship to support the emotional and practical needs of each client's creative practice. She holds an MA in Performance Making and an MA in Artist's Film & Moving Image, both from Goldsmiths University, London. She has exhibited at South London Gallery, Tate Modern, Raven Row, The KW Institute, New Contemporaries, Film London's Selected Program, among others. She is also a cofounder of the artist collective East London Cable.
